During May I was two times too one of the most amazing fjords in Norway, Lysefjorden. First time was together with a Swiss friend. We started on a nice boat trip through the 42 km long fjord, for spending the night



before we hiked and climbed out to the big rock at Kjærag (see picture). The next day we entered the Pulpit Rock. The last day of the week, we celebrated the National Day of Norway (May 17th) at Stavanger. The next weekend there was a new trip to Stavanger and The Pulpit Rock-dancing-festival, where Birgitte had the pleasure to learn herself some dancing skills. Due to some bad food the day before, I didn't feel too good that day, so it was really an express sight sing through the abandoned old city. The local buss brought me further to Phnom Penh, and visits to Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum and the Killing Fields gave me a huge insight from the time of Khmer Rouge (1975-78). My trip through Vietnam started at Saigon with the Vietnam War museum, which gave a quite different view of the war, than what you find in the American movies. I visited a coconut-caramel-factory at Mekong Delta and went for crawling through the Cu Chi Tunnels from the Vietnam War. At the mountains of Da Lat there was a hiking trip, and after a flight to Hanoi for visiting the Snake Village, the tour in Vietnam ended on a bout trip at Halong Bay with

canoeing and swimming in amazing water. Before the long flight back home, I took a detour to Hong Kong and Macau for a couple of days.

As earlier years, there have been some trips with the little boat to some nice islands. I don't think there is a real summer without. There has also been a wedding and a bachelor party for a friend, which always are nice occasions.

I still work at PwC Consulting, and have been working on an exciting investment project during the spring semester; else there isn't much news in that area.

I will as earlier celebrate Christmas with my family in Sandefjord,
